27 confirmed species + 1 unconfirmed


- 24 Cetaceans (20 *Odontocetes*, 4 *mysticete*)








National Laws

FAO 185

 Ban on the taking or catching, selling, purchasing, possessing, transporting and exporting of dolphins

FAO 185-1

 Amending FAO 185 by adding whales and porpoises

FAO 208

 Conservation of rare, threatened and endangered fishery/ aquatic species

Observer Program




Tri-national marine mammal survey


